# CLUBBUILDING

#### **CLUB RUSH**

Get some of your current members to help get new members. Get everyone to dress the same so your club looks unified. As the president you should make sure everyone has a job to make fliers, posters, sign-up sheets, spirit wear, noise makers, and anything else that will appeal to new members. Publicize our big events like Fall Rally, DCON, and your big service projects. Talk to your Lieutenant Governor to see what tips they can give.

#### **EVENTS**

Start of the year with diverse events. Have a club social one weekend and a service project the next weekend. Show that Key Club is diverse and full of fun and service.

#### **ELECTIONS**

Offer members the Class Representative position which gives a good opportunity for incoming freshman and other class leaders. Each club should be electing these officers at the beginning of the year.

#### **SPIRIT**

Show spirit and enthusiasm and smile to show that you love Key Club. Don't get too carried away with spirit though. You don't want to intimidate new members with our intense spirit. Let them gradually get comfortable with our intensity.

### **CLUB MEETINGS**

Should follow an official procedure with a set agenda (Pledge of Allegiance, Key Club Pledge, etc.) to make sure a level of professionalism is set, but also make it a little fun. Offer ice breakers to get new members involved and if you can, serve free pizza or candy.

#### **SPIRIT**

Make new members feel welcomed and special. Inside jokes make others feel uncomfortable so try to stay away from them. Do not let old members clique and exclude everyone else. Allow new members to introduce themselves and maybe even give them FRIENDLY stickers nothing that says "noob" or "freshman!" Use stickers that say "I came to serve!" or "I'm excited for my first year of Key Club"

As treasurer, you will need to login into Kiwanis' Membership Update Center and update all new club information. A invoice will be generated after and dues will need to be paid via mail or Paypal.

First day Dues can be turned in: Early Bird Deadline Regular Deadline

October 1st November 1st **December 1st** 

IMPORTANT: These are deadline dates. Do NOT postmark dues invoices on the day of. Turn in your dues invoices to the International Office a week in advance before the final deadline at the latest!

# THINGS to do during SEPTEMBER

#### Get Acquainted with the Membership Update Center

http://soapmu.kiwanis.org/

The Membership Update Center is being updated for the 2009-2010 year and will be ready after September 7th to process your club's membership. After the seventh, the home page will provide practice login codes to allow you to get familiar with the Dues process before actually submitting invoices into Kiwanis International.

#### Keep an Eye Out for the Mail

Notify your faculty advisor that an IMPORTANT letter from Kiwanis International will arrive in the mailbox during this month. The letter will contain important login information to the Membership Update Center. If you have recently changed advisors, please ask your old advisor to keep an eye out. If your faculty advisor no longer works at your school, politely ask your school office to correctly direct the letter. If the letter does not arrive *after* September ends, allow *your advisor* to call (800) KIW-ANIS. Be prepared to have the Club Number ready. (800) KIW-ANIS will not work with students, only with advisors.

#### Work with the Club Secretary

Work with the Secretary by organizing Member Information Forms. Members during every new Key Club term should supply the following information (as requested during the membership update process): full name, address, email, phone number, birth date, graduation year, and gender. Keep these forms organized and have them ready when paying for dues. It is important that all information needs to be kept safely, confidentially, and respect the privacy of the members.

#### **Membership Awareness**

As one of the goals of the CNH District, we would like to have 40,000 busy bees this year. To reach that goal, try your best to publicize Key Club to your school. Looking over your budget, decide if making posters and giving out candy are good investments to have more students interested in Key Club. You can take advantage of penniless advertizing through the school bulletin and materials provided by the school's associated student body. Work with your board and do all you can to increase membership this year! If membership increase is difficult to your respected area, do all you can to retain the same amount of members from last year! Good Luck!

raised \$758,433.20 for UNICEF. In the 2008-09 term, Key Club International raised \$697,709.99. As you can see, the amount KCI raised has decreased in one year. However, now come a new project and a new goal: Operation Uruguay. Operation Uruguay's goal is to improve the living conditions of adolescents in Uruguay. Key Club International has set a goal of \$1.5 Million to be raised for the new focus. We can help reach this goal and increase this term's raised money for UNICEF!

All information concerning awards will be posted on the CyberKey in mid-August. Every year, officers in Cali-Nev-Ha get a chance to be awarded Distinguished or Outstanding for their position! But this year things have changed on how you can apply. All officer recognition contests will go green. This year officers will have the choice of submitting an electronic submission, a CD submission, or a binder submission.

#### The Contest Deadlines Is Set:

The final Registration and Submission date for all contests have been set! Be sure to mark this day in red on your calendar if you plan on applying to any awards: March 5, 2010. This means that all contest materials must be received on this date by the close of the District Office regular business hours . If your contest is required to be mailed to the District Office this is not a postmark date, you must mail your submissions a few days ahead of time to be safe. There will be absolutely no exceptions for late submissions. Anything received after the deadline will not be considered for judging.

#### Step One

Mark March 5, 2010 on your calendar as the deadline to have all awards submitted.

#### Step Two:

Become familiar with the guidelines! Plan to follow those requirements and surpass them! Talk to you Lt. Governors and express your interest to apply, they can help you out or point you in the right direction to find help.

#### Step Three:

Keep all your work throughout the year in a single folder saved to your desktop or on a flash drive (keep a backup as well) to build upon this throughout the year. Within this folder, organize your work into subfolders that apply to your position (Agendas, Minutes, Financial Records, Bulletins, Articles, etc.). This way all you work is in one place and easy to look at when it is time to apply and you can easily choose what you would like to submit.

#### Step Four:

Start the recommendation letters early and give yourself a lot of time to compile your submission.

#### Step Five:

Make sure to complete and submit any forms on time. No exceptions will be made; you don't want to miss out because of one little form.

#### Step Six:

Be recognized at District Convention in front of all of Cali-Nev-Ha and show your home club that you went "A Buzz and BEEyond" your call of duty.

# ADVERTISING tips

Whether it's a Key Club meeting or Fall Rally, always remember these points when advertising:

- Be concise and straight to the point, but don't leave out important information
- Be consistent with the information you are giving out
- Be catchy with phrases, images, etc. to leave an impression
- Be clear and confident
- Know your audience and how to relate to them

# **DUES (important!)**

Dues are very important because without paying them, you cannot gain membership to Key Club. Although Early Bird is no longer recognized in the CNH district, still be proactive and receive and submit dues as early as possible. Below is a list of important dates regarding dues.

- Begin Sending in dues: October 1st
- ullet On Time: Dues in by December 1st
- After Dec. 1: Clubs become delinquent
- After February 1<sup>st</sup>: clubs become suspended

After September 1<sup>st</sup>: A fee is required to restart the Key Club as well as the dues

Chartering formally recognizes a Key Club into a school, and is required for all clubs. Once chartered, a club simply pays annual dues to continue the existence of the respective Key Club. More information can be found on the CyberKey, and steps are given below:
