SERVICE

Remember that our goal for this year is to serve 750,000 hours of service in the CNH District. We're past halfway done with our PTP goal of \$75,000 so I know we can accomplish this goal too!

Here are some quick tips on how to increase hours:

- 1. Have a sign-up sheet for all your events. Whether it be an online form or a simple sheet of paper, have a way for members to sign up to attend a service project. Ask for their name and phone number so that you can call them the night before to remind them about the event. You don't want committed members to miss an event just because they forgot.
- 2. Arrange carpools. Help the environment while helping each other. Some members can't attend an event because they don't have a ride available. Fix that by offering carpools to take members. Ask old members or members who you know are going if they would be available to take other members and set up a meeting point like a local park or your school.
- 3. Reward active members. Although they do get community service hours for attending events, give them even more incentives! It can be as simple as having everyone at your club meeting applaud for members who went to the past event, or as cool as giving them free divisional t-shirts from last year. Also, try a Member of the Month system.
- **4.** Have a lot of projects available. Everyone is busy these days so don't force anyone to attend events. Your job is to give your members the opportunity to do service so have a project every weekend, plan one right after school every Friday, help teachers during lunch. That was just an example, but the point is to have a lot of options and vary the type of project you have to appeal to everyone.
- **5.** Attend the projects. Remember that you're a member too and you should be an exemplary member. You don't want your members going to an event and being lost. It's always nice to have a familiar face to find at the event so everyone knows what's going on. If you can't make it, make sure another officer does.

member RECOGNITION

Key Club hours VS service hours

Here is one of my favorite ideas to get your club excited. At my home club, you need 200 Key Club hours to receive a graduation sash when you graduate as a senior.

WHAT IS A KEY CLUB HOUR?

Well, your members spend a lot of time working for Key Club even though it may not be at a service project. Some examples are like attending Regional Training Conference (RTC), socials, Divisional Council Meetings (DCM's), Fall Rally, DCON, etc. Although your members cannot count those listed events as "service hours" they should still get recognized for it. That is why you establish "Key Club hours" to give them credit for their time spent attending Key Club functions. Make sure you separate the two types of hours separate. Service hours can be a part of their Key Club hours but Key Club hours should not be counted as service hours. Then set a goal for them and establish a prize.

DCON AWARDS

Have an amazing club? Are you and your board members great officers? Then get rewarded for all your hard work! The guidelines for the CNH District Level Recognition have been posted to the CNH CyberKey.

SECRETARY tips

- Keep all of your files separated in different files/folders. Stay organized! Ideas on how to divide your work: Minutes, Sign-in Sheets, Sign-Up Sheets, Service Hour Records, MRFs.
- Keep a to-do-list! Set EARLY deadlines for all your work. If you
 miss those deadlines, no worries, you still have a little bit of time
 left to finish it so it is on-time!
- Keep track of time! Don't procrastinate and make sure you do all of your work.

DUES

FAQ

How many dues must I turn in to get the early bird award?

This year, CNH's focus is *not* Early Bird dues. This year, your club could be recognized for Member Retention, CNH's new focus. Awards are not given out because clubs have collected a set amount of dues. Ideally, a club in good standing is a club with at least 15 members. Of course, many clubs in our district exceeds far beyond 15 members.

How does the office know which members paid if we do not turn in a roster with who have paid?

The generated roster is for your club's benefit and records. Key Club International's organized electronic membership update system also keeps a record of your members—there is no need to send in a roster to them.

Is it possible to add more members and send in more invoices after the first one?

Yes, and please do! When you are finished with your first invoice, you can always log into the Membership Update Center to add more members. You will *not* be charged again for the former members you have already inputted, only the new ones. Good luck!

My club has just been chartered this year, do we pay dues?

Your \$600 charter fee includes membership fees for the 1st year of dues for those members that are on the charter petition. Any members joining after the original charter being sent in have to pay dues.

Where can I find the status of the dues payment?

The home page of cnhkeyclub.org has a pencil called "Current Club Dues" which is updated regularly, check to see membership numbers your club had during previous years.

DUES cont'd

This year, CNH is NOT recognizing Early Bird dues. Your ultimate goal, as a CNH Treasurer, is to retain at least the same amount of members you had last year BEFORE the December 1st deadline. Before this deadline, urge all your classmates and friends to join your club. Remember to send in have you have before December 1st so you will have a club in good standing. Aiming for retention already makes your club look great, and aiming to increase membership looks even better. After Key Club week, your campus should be more aware about your club, so use that promotion to acquire more service into your team!

Remember to be on time and send in your first invoice before the December 1st deadline. If you're afraid you won't have enough members before this deadline, try setting your own earlier deadlines for your members to pay their dues so they are included on the 1st dues invoice, and they can be sent in and received by December 1st. You can send in more than one invoice prior to December 1st. The International Office will be closing their 'on-time' mailbox on that day, so be sure to mail your invoice early enough so it reaches to Indianapolis on time. You may still turn in dues after the deadline, but your club will not be in good standing until after the first invoice is processed. Good luck! Maintain to retain!

fight poverty. The goal for this week is to raise awareness of the huge problem of poverty. Poverty acts in a cycle: an increase in poverty leads to a decrease in the amount of people who can afford goods. This can cause workplaces to close leading to a loss of jobs, therefore increasing poverty even more. According to *globalissues.org*, half of the children in the world live in poverty and of that half, about 26,500 die of poverty every day. So how will you participate during Combat Poverty Week? - UNICEF RELIEF EFFORTS IN SOUTH ASIA

The Philippines, Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos, Bhutan, Indonesia, and the Pacific Islands; all of these countries and areas are currently suffering from naturals disasters from typhoons to earthquakes and tsunamis. The extreme conditions have deprived the people of these regions food, blankets, clothing, hygiene, and education. The long exposure to the elements has increased the risk of disease spread and these countries lack the resources to attain stability.

Of the 9.8 million people affected by these natural disasters, 3.8 million of them are children, the future of these countries. In order to maintain a bright future for these countries, UNICEF has extended a helping hand. The organization has provided medical care, clean water, and shelter for the suffering but it still needs help! Your donations to UNICEF can make a huge difference in a child's life whether it is a blanket to keep the child from catching hypothermia to a vaccine that would cure a water-borne disease. Many children in South Asia will not be able to spend their holidays in houses with gifts and turkeys, but in shelters with crackers. Be the difference in a child's life and make a donation to UNICEF.

UNICEF is one of three of Key Club International's Service Partners. Thousands of CNH Key Clubbers participated in Trick-or-Treating for UNICEF last month. Money raised by Key Clubbers through Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF will benefit Operation Uruguay: Protecting the Rights of Children, a program to assist the families of Uruguay in education and health.
